



Abstract Submission Guidelines

1. The abstract must follow a structured format for one of the following categories. Components of a structured abstract differ by the type of presentation but should include:
 - a. **Critically Appraised Topic:** Clinical Scenario, Clinical Question, Summary of Key Findings, Clinical Bottom Line, Strength of Recommendation, Search Strategy, and Summary of Best Evidence.
 - b. **Clinical Case Reports:** Background, Differential Diagnosis, Treatment, Uniqueness, and Conclusions.
 - c. **Original Research:** Context, Objective, Design, Setting, Patient or Other Participants, Interventions, Main Outcome Measures, Results, Conclusions.
 2. The abstract is limited to 500 words or 3000 characters (including spaces) and must be typed, single spaced. Please do not use enhanced font, such as bold, underline or italicized text. The system will accept special characters ©, ®, &, %, etc. We recommend drafting the abstract in a word file, copy and paste it into the space available within the online submission process.
 3. Indicate your registration number, name and initials, institution, city and state where the research or case report was conducted.
 4. Please include the names of any co-author(s): Type the last name, then initials (first and middle, without periods) followed by a comma then continue with the other author(s) (if any).
 5. Students may select (from the drop-down menu) the type of poster project:
 - a. Critically Appraised Topic (PICO or PIO)
 - b. Clinical Case Report (injury, illness)
 - c. Original Research (experimental, survey)
 6. Please submit only if you or your co-author(s) are able to attend the meeting. If accepted for presentation, the original abstract will appear as submitted in the conference proceedings. Be sure to carefully check for spelling and grammatical errors before submitting the abstract for review.
