

Standards for Accreditation

Open Comment Period Ends July 31, 2017

The Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE) requests your feedback on the revised draft of the Standards for Accreditation of Professional Athletic Training Programs. This draft includes both the Operational Standards (program logistics) and the Curricular Content (what programs must teach). Both types of Standards are combined in one document that can be viewed HERE.



This draft of the Standards incorporates feedback from the Athletic Training Strategic Alliance (Board of Certification, Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education, National Athletic Trainers' Association, and the NATA Research & Education Foundation), CAATE physician partners, NATA committees, and the public open comment conducted during Summer 2016. *The open comment is now open and will remain open until July 31, 2017.*

Your input will help shape the future of athletic training education. Your feedback is vital to the development of Standards and Programs. The CAATE appreciates the insights, suggestions, and recommendations of all who participate in the Open Comment.

Georgia Legislature Passes Licensure Exemption for Visiting ATs

During the recent legislative session of the Georgia General Assembly, <u>SB 47</u> was introduced to allow visiting licensed healthcare providers from other states to treat their athletes when traveling to Georgia without violating the <u>Georgia AT Practice Act</u>. Until the bill was passed, medical professionals holding a license in their home state were required to obtain a Georgia license when crossing into our state or be in violation of Georgia law.

Originally, <u>SB 47</u> only allowed exemption from Georgia license requirements for physicians and physician assistants. GATA's public affairs group, <u>GeorgiaLink</u>, realized the bill's potential benefit for athletic trainers and brought it to the attention of the GATA Executive Board. Through their vigilant work, the bill was amended to add athletic trainers to the list of licensed healthcare providers who are exempt from licensure when travelling with a team into Georgia. Certain limitations are included in the bill, but visiting healthcare providers are generally exempt from obtaining a Georgia license under the following conditions:

- Hold a license as a physician, physician's assistant, or athletic trainer in their home state
- A formal agreement exists between the medical professional and the team to provide care to the members of the team during their travel in Georgia.
- Travel into Georgia lasts no more than 10 days (extensions may be requested).
- No one is treated by the medical professional outside of team members.

This <u>bill passed both chambers of the Georgia General Assembly unanimously</u> and was signed by Governor Deal in May to take effect on July 1.

The bill is very similar to <u>federal legislation supported by the NATA</u> that would allow all healthcare providers holding a license in their home state to travel across state lines without obtaining a license in the second state. The federal legislation, <u>SB 808</u>, has already passed the House and is now <u>being considered in the Senate</u>.





What is an NPI number?

A National Provider Identifier (NPI) is a unique 10-digit identification number used in standard health care transactions. The NPI fulfills a requirement of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). You only have to apply once, and the NPI number stays with you (like your BOC certification number or your state license number). **The NPI identifies you as a health care provider to other health care providers.**

Why is an NPI number important for ATs?

The most important reason for all ATs to get their NPI is to increase the representation of our profession in the healthcare market. We are stronger together, and this most definitely pertains to market penetration of our profession. Your NPI number is the identifier that is used by numerous entities including employers, state licensing boards, regulatory agencies, insurers, CMS, and legislators. Having an NPI number is important because it allows ATs to be recognized using the same identifier by which other health care professionals are identified. An NPI# is required to serve on board or committee positions in NATA and SEATA.

How to apply for your NPI

Applying for your NPI is quick, easy and free. Visit the <u>National Plan & Provider Enumeration</u> <u>System</u> to complete your application today.
