I am seeking your assistance in advertising our program of "Graduate Study in Health Education or Physical Education and Internship in Athletic Training." At present, we are expecting three vacancies in the Tucson high schools under the program. There is a possibility that more positions will open up. I would certainly appreciate it if you could put the following information describing the program in your next District Newsletter or include it in any other appropriate correspondence with your District members:

The University of Arizona, Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation and the Tucson Public High Schools are announcing the third year of their program of "Graduate Study in Health or Physical Education and Internship in Athletic Training" for the 1971-72 school year. Those accepted into the program will have an opportunity to pursue their Master's degree in Health Education or Physical Education at the University of Arizona and will be assigned to one of the Tucson high schools as Head Athletic Trainer. Minimum 9-month salaries are approximately \$2,800. This involves from 20-25 hours of work per week.

Applicants should hold a bachelor's degree with a major in Physical Education or a comprehensive major in Health, Physical Education and Recreation. A C+ undergraduate grade point average is required for entrance to the Graduate College. Applicants should also have at least two years of experience as a college or university student trainer. Applications should be submitted as soon as possible. Appointments will be made on or before April 15, 1971.
